USING NUMBERS



Matching quantities, number names, and symbols from 1 to 10 (and beyond) is important mathematics learning for young children.

Watch and Listen While Children Play-Learn About Their Thinking

Watch children:

- notice and talk about number symbols from 1-10 and more.
- match number symbols with collections of things.
- notice and order number symbols written on cards and objects.

Comparing

When children organise small collections to work out the total, encourage them to match the number symbol, or make a collection to match a number symbol.

- What number is on the gold coin? Show me this many fingers.
- What number is on the birthday card? Show me this many candles.
- What number is written on the packet of biscuits? Show me this many biscuits?
- How many eggs in the carton?
 Find the number on the packet that tells you this.
- How many pencils in the packet? Find the number on the packet that tells you this.

Everyday

Look for **number symbols** and **match** these to collections and when you are:

- Preparing a meal.
- Dressing for the day or dressing for bed.
- Going shopping.
- Reading a story.
- Driving in the car.
- Walking down the street,
- Catching a train.
- Moving between rooms in the house.
- Visiting family and friends.
- Playing in the park.



Talking and Pescribing

When you talk with your children about the number symbols you see and how many objects or actions this represents, then they will learn and use these number symbols also.

- this many (4) of something in the kitchen.
- a **5** in the kitchen.
- **numbers written** on the DVD covers. What are they?
- **numbers written** in the book. What are they?

- some numbers more than 10.
